# Good News


- Retention refund to agencies
- Workers' compensation administrative fees won't be charged 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> quarter
- Savings and refunds since December 2010

<b>Retention Refund</b>	<b>\$985,000</b>
<b>Administration Fees</b>	<b>\$186,000</b>
<b>Dividend</b>	<b>\$152,000</b>
<b>Total savings and refunds</b>	<b>\$1,323,000</b>
